# UNDERGROUND SERVICE REMINDER

All underground construction paperwork and fees for this year need to be submitted by October 31, 2025. If you have construction plans that are not already scheduled, call Oakdale Electric Cooperative

today at 1-800-241-2468. We cannot guarantee completion of any underground work after this date due to possible frost conditions; however, we will do everything possible to meet your construction needs and install your electrical service before winter.



## WISCONSIN RESIDENTIAL ENERGY SALES TAX EXEMPTION Coming October 1, 2025

As part of the 2025-2027 Wisconsin State Budget, the 5% sales tax on primary residential electricity accounts will be eliminated effective October 1, 2025. Primary residential member accounts will no longer pay the 5% sales tax on residential electricity statements, which includes state, county, and city sales taxes – all are waived for qualifying residential energy usage.

The exemption applies only to bills issued on or after October 1, 2025. Therefore, this change will be reflected on September usage statements received in October. For questions about your account or billing, contact our member services team at 608-372-4131.


### **DUAL FUEL HEAT NOTICE**
