



# ~Board President & General Manager Message~

The rising cost of energy has captured our full attention. As our eyes look to the future, we realize that we must change both the way we produce and the way we use energy. This will require a partnership between Oakdale Electric Cooperative and our members. By far the best way to manage the cost of our electric bills is to use electricity wisely. The reality is that we have to work together. "Control What You Can – Together We Save" is a fitting theme for this year's annual report, especially given the challenges and opportunities facing Oakdale Electric today and in the future. We can manage the cost of electricity, but we can't manage how much you use or how wisely you use it.

Our challenge this year has been weathering storms on a wide variety of fronts. Whether it was the recession, or the proposed new energy legislation, which threatens to skyrocket electric bills; or the hardships created by Mother Nature, which may have been the quickest and easiest of all to handle. Through it all, Oakdale Electric Cooperative's employees and board of directors kept a steady course with the determination they have always had – providing our members with the best service possible and ensuring them reliable electricity at a reasonable price.

To help us educate members on the growing challenges we face, Oakdale Electric Cooperative and more than 690 other Touchstone Energy Cooperatives in 46 states are working to help their members use energy more effectively and efficiently through a new, national campaign called "Together We Save." The campaign focuses on how small changes in electricity use can add up. More information on "Together We Save" along with energy saving tips can be found on our website.

Climate change has become a major issue. Everyone who lives in Wisconsin will be affected directly by the Clean Energy Jobs Act if passed into law. The question of whether carbon shall be regulated and how it shall be regulated is the great uncertainty. There is no consensus on what form a cap-and-trade system would take, which has stalled in legislation.

Oakdale Electric Cooperative will support climate change legislation that is fair to all regions of the country, affordable and achievable. Co-ops have stepped up to challenges in the past, and we have no doubt our response to this challenge will be any different in the end. But we need your help in relaying to Congress just how important it is to keep climate change legislation fair, affordable, and technologically achievable. It is important to make your voice heard in legislative debates, please take a moment to contact your State Legislator regarding the Clean Energy Jobs Act and let them know your concern about the

financial impact this bill will have on utility bills. To make your voice heard, join the Our Energy, Our Future® grassroots campaign to take part in shaping our energy future.

As we enter 2010, Dairyland Power Cooperative's wholesale power cost, which accounts for 63 percent of Oakdale Electric's operating budget, is facing tremendous upward pressure. We are facing ever-increasing costs from areas over which we have virtually no control. Dairyland Power Cooperative is facing potential new carbon legislation, growing renewable energy standards, tougher environmental regulations and challenging energy efficiency mandates. All of these cause electric rates to escalate.

As a member of Oakdale Electric Cooperative, you have the opportunity to be part of an effort that combines strength of numbers with the power of a few cents. You are eligible to participate in Operation Round Up®, and join "the power of many, helping others."

Members who wish to participate have their monthly electric bill rounded to the next dollar amount. Anything from a penny to 99 cents, goes into the Operation Round-Up® account — six dollars a year may seem like small change, but it's small change that changes lives. This "spare change" is combined with other members' money and placed in a trust fund administered by an independent Board of Directors. The Trust is made up of representatives from the communities we serve who serve on the Board on a voluntary basis. Typically, the funding is used to address crucial needs such as food, clothing, shelter, and medical care, but it is not limited to these categories.
