ALL CHARGED UP!

Oakdale Electric Cooperative partnered with Dairyland Power Cooperative, Ground Round Grill & Bar - Tomah, and the Michigan to Montana I-94 Clean Fuel Corridor project to bring the first public electric vehicle (EV) charging station to western Wisconsin.

The co-op's business member, Ground Round Grill & Bar - Tomah, was the perfect location to house the charging station because of its proximity to I-94 corridor. This location fills a large gap for charging stations available for travelers going between Minneapolis and Chicago, thus making it easier to drive EV.

The charging station allows for up to three EVs to charge at the same time, and can provide a full charge in 45 minutes. The station includes one DC fast charger and two Level II chargers. The DC fast charger provides 200 miles of battery range for every hour the vehicle is plugged in, while the two Level II chargers provide 25 miles of battery range for every hour the vehicle is plugged in.
