
First Time Attendee's **Member Appreciation Day Guide**



This is the time of year when cooperatives across the country, including Oakdale Electric Cooperative, celebrate who we are and more importantly, the members we serve.

common good. Your electric co-op exists to provide safe, reliable, and affordable energy to you, the members of the co-op. Equally important is our mission to enrich the lives of the members we serve.

As a co-op, we are well-suited to meet the needs of the community because we are locally governed. Oakdale Electric's leadership team and employees live right here in the community. Our board of directors, who helps set long-term priorities for the co-op, lives locally on co-op lines. These board members have been elected to the position by neighbors like you.

We know our members (that's you!) have a valuable perspective. That's why we are continually seeking your input. Whether through community events, our social media channels, or the annual meeting, we want to hear from you.

Our close connection to the community ensures we get a firsthand perspective on local priorities, thereby enabling us to make more informed decisions on long-term investments, such as community solar programs, equipment and technology upgrades, and electric vehicle programs.

Another feature that sets our co-op

apart from a traditional utility are two of our core principles, "Concern for Community" and "Cooperation among Cooperatives." A partnership with Oakdale Credit Union and CoBank allowed for a total donation of \$22,500 to be gifted to the communities of La Valle, Elroy, and Kendall to assist with necessary park repairs still needed from the 2018 flood.

We participate in the Youth Leadership Congress, where we take our community's young people to the University of Wisconsin–River Falls for a three-day conference to develop their leadership skills while learning the purpose, operation, and scope of cooperative businesses.

Ultimately, the larger community benefits from these programs because of you and your neighbors. You empower the co-op through your membership and through your participation in and support of these programs.

We hope you will think of Oakdale Electric Cooperative as more than your energy provider, but instead as a local business that supports this community and powers economic development and prosperity for the people.
